




Tourism accounts for 7.1 percent of Africa's GDP and contributes \$169 billion to the continent's economy





During COVID-19 Plans have changed. Countries **fighting for vaccine globally**. **South Africa put vaccine on hold** due to effectiveness against variants falling from 66% effective to 57%.

As of 18th Feb, vaccination plans for COVID-19 vaccines from 35 low-income African countries eligible for free vaccines from the **COVAX** Facility have been accepted by an independent regional review committee, says WHO.

The lockdown has seen all spas in South Africa close their doors.

The spa industry is experiencing **significant losses** as businesses shut for good.

Current Picture – Challenges Today



According to World Bank report, Sub-Saharan Africa activity shrank an estimated 3.7% last year 2020. *Extreme poverty has pushed* millions more people into extreme poverty due to per capita drop income. This will set average living standards back by a decade or more in a quarter of Sub-Saharan African economies.

Growth in Sub Saharan Africa is expected to resume at a "moderate average pace of 2 percent" in 2021, which is essentially zero in per capita terms and well below previous projections.

The <u>World Travel and Tourism Council</u> estimates 100 million tourism-related jobs have already been lost globally, including nearly **eight million in Africa**, due to the COVID-19 crisis.

Chinese foreign minister Wang Yi started his **five-nation tour** in Africa, which will take him to Nigeria, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Botswana, Tanzania and Seychelles.

The closure of tourism businesses such as hotels, attractions and other services including Spa and Wellness businesses have had *massive job losses across the tourism industry in Africa*.

Collecting data through surveys is a critical first step to help the Wellness industry understand the effects of COVID-19 on Wellness tourism businesses—and then to respond with targeted solutions.

Current Picture – Opportunities



UNWTO indicates that confidence in Africa's recovery remains very strong compared to other world regions.

African markets have an advantage in 2021 and beyond, says Renaissance Capital's Global Chief Economist Charlie Robertson, because the continent has been the least hurt by COVID-19 relative to other regions (a story like that of the 2008-2009 global financial crisis).

Getting Africa to "catch up" is the wrong framing, says Afro Champions Co-Founder Edem Adzogenu. To him, the attitude must rather be: "can you turn in a completely different direction and perfect another model that passes the others but also learns from them."

The African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) can be a "game-changer," especially when it comes to infrastructure of technology in the digital space and roads to get tourism to their destinations safely, and cross boarder sales of wellness products.

Once tourists' dollars start flowing into the continent again and with spa and wellness businesses taking medical grad level hygiene protocols to make guests feel safe.

Current Picture – Opportunities



Spa Therapists have become *entrepreneurs over night* and started mobile treatments in order to sustain food on the table

Spa and Wellness facilities customers and are especially the domestic tourists. Rising need for mental wellness, stress reduction, nutritional assessments, counselling, holistic personal wellness plans and coaching.

Wellness tourism grew faster than other tourism, increasing interest in alternative treatments such as yoga, reiki, mindfulness sessions and sound, light and water therapy. spas were also offering medical aesthetics treatments, which include micro-needling, chemical peels, laser and intense pulsed light treatments

Aggressive marketing needs to be done by the governments and businesses on Spa and Wellness attractions. Covid19 has highlighted the importance of a holistic health and wellness approach.

African governments can offer *tax exemptions and wellness tourism holidays to wellness businesses* to help them recover from the consequences of the pandemic.

Spa owners must consider spa design of the future now.




